Age Friendly

This award acknowledges the work of groups/organisations/individuals who focus on the needs of older people, enhancing wellbeing and or promoting an Age Friendly community. Groups who show positive intergenerational outcomes can also apply under this category. *Example: Physical, Social, Wellbeing & Active Retired Groups, Women's Groups, Men's Groups, Meals on Wheels, etc.*

Arts & Culture

This award acknowledges groups/organisations/individuals who elevate their area by protecting and fostering the Arts, Culture and Heritage of their local community through collective creative projects. **Example**: Arts, Crafts, Choirs, Dance, Drama, Literature, Music, Festivals, Conservation, Irish Language and Heritage, etc.

Child/Youth Development and Education

This award acknowledges groups/organisations/individuals who improve and enhance the quality of life for communities by providing educational and social development opportunities for children/youth. **Example**: Community Play Groups, Youth Groups, Child & Youth Sports Groups, Afterschool Programmes, Drop In Clubs, Youth Cafes, etc.

Community & Civic Pride

This award acknowledges groups/organisations/individuals that provide valuable leadership in their areas through active citizenship in their communities and by promoting a sense of civic pride. *Example:* Community Facilities, Community Services, Community Groups, Civic Activities, Civic Engagement, Residents Associations, etc.

Disability & Neurodiversity

This award acknowledges groups/organisations/individuals who promote accessibility and inclusion. **Example**: Physical Disability, Cognitive Ability, Neurodivergent & Autism Spectrum Support Groups, Visually/Hearing Impaired Groups, Peer Support Groups, Wellbeing & Social Groups, any other sensory and psychological disability, etc.

Environment & Climate Action

This award acknowledges groups/organisations/individuals who impact positively on the environment. **Example**: Environmental Groups, Community Groups promoting Environmental Awareness, Community Gardens, Tidy Towns/Village, Estate Management Groups, Climate Action, Biodiversity, Coastal protection/cleaning, Community Groups promoting Environmental Awareness, etc.

Equality, Diversity, Inclusion & Integration

This award acknowledges the work of groups/organisations/individuals who focus on the needs of marginalised, minority/ethnic groups, new communities. **Example:** Unemployed/Low Income Groups, Travelling Community, Homelessness, Ethnic Minority Groups, The LGBTQ+ Community, Rurally Isolated Groups, Women's Groups, Men's Groups, etc.

Health and Wellbeing

This award acknowledges groups/organisations/individuals that promote physical and mental health and wellbeing focusing on prevention and keeping people healthier for longer. **Example:** Sports Groups, Mental Health Support Groups, Healthy Eating Programmes, Emergency Responders, etc.

General Information

Criteria for Nominations

Who is eligible to be nominated for a **Community Award?**

- Any locally based not-for-profit Community or Voluntary group/organisation in the County of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown
- Groups/organisations, in the County of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown, who can demonstrate an inclusive and transparent ethos
- Groups/organisations who are working to address the issues/target groups identified in the dlr LECP 2016/2021 <u>http://www.dlrcoco.ie/sites/default/files/atoms/files/dlr_lecp_april_2016.pdf</u>
- Groups/organisations who have an appropriate organisational structure and can demonstrate a commitment to good practice in line with the Governance Code or the Charities Governance Code
- Groups/organisations that are nominated must be registered with the DLR Public Participation Networking (PPN) or in the process of registering
- Any group/organisation nominee should be aware and accept that they are being nominated
- A group can be nominated under one category only for the Community Awards

Who is eligible to be nominated for a Volunteer Award?

- Any voluntary member of any locally based not-for-profit Community or Voluntary group/organisation in the County of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown
- Voluntary members of Groups/organisations, in the County of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown, who can demonstrate an inclusive and transparent ethos
- Voluntary members of Groups/organisations who are working to address the issues/target groups identified in the dlr LECP 2016/2021 http://www.dlrcoco.ie/sites/default/files/atoms/files/dlr_lecp_april_2016.pdf
- Voluntary members of Groups/organisations who have an appropriate organisational structure and can demonstrate a commitment to good practice in line with the Governance Code or the Charities Governance Code
- The Volunteer should be a member of a group/organisation that are registered with the DLR Public Participation Networking or in the process of registering
- Any volunteer nominee should be aware and accept that they are being nominated
- A volunteer can be nominated **under one category only for the Volunteer Awards.** Individuals who receive pay for their service will not be eligible
