



Highlights of the many events planned include an International Harbour Food Festival with over 25 unique vendors showcasing some of the finest food around; Viking longboats as seen on the Hit TV Show 'Vikings' will feature in a live re-enactment with longboats invading the Harbour; the launch of **The Kingstown** 200 Classic Boat Race will feature in the biennial Dún Laoghaire Regatta. The classic race will see Classic, Traditional and Old Gaffers Association racing added to the event.

Leopardstown link road upgrade

The newly reconfigured **Leopardstown Link Road and Roundabout** was officially opened at the end of April by An Cathaoirleach, Cllr Cormac Devlin. The new scheme was designed and managed by **dlr**, replacing the previous roundabout with a safer and more efficient signalised junction. It was introduced to manage heavy traffic in the area, incorporating a new link road which aims to improve traffic flow for commuters, while also helping improve connectivity for pedestrians and cyclists. The two year construction project, which cost €8.5m, came away with the best Civil Engineering Project prize at the Council & Community Awards earlier this year.



Calling all owners of vacant residential properties

Have you a residential property that is letting you down? And not making money for you? The Repair and Leasing Scheme was recently launched under the Governments' Action Plan for Housing and Homelessness 'Rebuilding Ireland'.

The scheme is targeted at owners who have residential properties which are lying vacant. We can assist you in ensuring that they comply with the required standards (Housing Standard for Rented Houses Regulations 2017).

Property owners can now avail of funding of up to a maximum of €40,000, to bring their vacant property up to the rental standards. In return for this funding they agree to enter into a lease agreement with **dlr** for a minimum of 10 years. The value of the repairs will be offset against the rental income received.

dlr achieves European Energy Certification

With Climate Change being a major talking point throughout the world, **dlr** has always been committed to continually improving how it manages energy. Part of this commitment includes a dedicated **dlr Energy Team** which manages the Council's commitment to energy management with continual improvement in efficiency and performance being a key goal. Energy efficiency programmes are encouraged and promoted to ensure that the policy is appropriate to the nature and scale of **dlr**'s energy use and consumption.

One of the key objectives of the **dlr Energy Team** was to achieve Certification to ISO50001 Energy Management System. This certification recognises a system that encourages the reduction of all attributable **dlr** energy use by 33% by the end of 2020, from a baseline year of 2009, and also to be in compliance with Energy Legislation. The Public Sector has been identified as critical to attaining and encouraging reduced energy consumption, reaching National energy targets and Ireland meeting its obligation under Climate Change Mitigation. We are delighted that **dlr** has achieved this Certification and is the first Dublin Local Authority to do so.

Deimhniú Fuinnimh Eorpach bainte amach ag dlr

Anois agus an tAthrú Aeráide i mbéal an phobail ar fud fad an domhain, tá dlr tiomanta ón gcéad lá riamh don chaoi a mbainistíonn sé fuinneamh a athrú chun feabhais. Tá **Foireann Fuinnimh dlr** i gcroílár an tiomantais sin, ar grúpa í a bhainistíonn tiomantas na Comhairle do bhainistiú fuinnimh agus a dhéanann gach iarracht éifeachtúlacht agus feidhmíocht fuinnimh a fheabhsú gach uile lá beo. Spreagtar cláir éifeachtúlachta fuinnimh agus cuirtear chun cinn iad d'fhonn a chinntiú go mbíonn an beartas oiriúnach do nádúr agus do scála an fhuinnimh a úsáideann agus a ídíonn **dlr**.

Ar cheann de na príomhchuspóirí a bhí ag **Foireann Fuinnimh dlr** ná Deimhniú ISO50001: Córas Bainistíochta Fuinnimh a bhaint amach. Tugann an deimhniú sin aitheantas do chóras a bhfuil sé mar aidhm aige gach fuinneamh a bhfuil **dlr** taobh thiar de a laghdú 33% idir 2009 agus deireadh na bliana 2020, mar aon le reachtaíocht a bhaineann le cúrsaí fuinnimh a chomhlíonadh ina hiomláine. Aithníodh go mbeadh an Earnáil Phoiblí ríthábhachtach i dtaobh ídiú laghdaithe fuinnimh a bhaint amach agus a spreagadh, spriocanna náisiúnta fuinnimh a shásamh agus cur ar chumas na hÉireann an dualgas atá uirthi faoi Mhaolú an Athraithe Aeráide a chomhlíonadh. Tá lúcháir orainn go bhfuil an deimhniú sin bainte amach ag **dlr** agus gurb é an chéad Údarás Áitiúil i mBaile Átha Cliath é leis an méid sin a dhéanamh.

Centre of the **Community**

President to attend Shanganagh Park House Celebrations

Shanganagh Park House, owned by dlr and managed by a voluntary Board of Management, has been run as a Community Centre for the past 40 years, providing a valuable service in Shanganagh and surrounding areas. Almost 200 years old, Shanganagh Park House stands regally at the top of Rathsallagh Avenue, and is known locally as "The Old Lady".

Since it became a Community Centre back in 1977, hundreds of people have participated in the Community Employment Scheme, in the childcare facilities on offer and in the various community groups, youth groups and summer projects that it runs.

The President of Ireland, Michael D. Higgins will be joining us, along with Shanganagh Park House staff, residents and community groups, to celebrate this landmark birthday on 31 May as we acknowledge the hundreds of people who have participated in all that The Old Lady has offered in her 40 years of service as a community centre.



Freedom of Entry to the County

It was all hands on deck on 31 March when dlr had the pleasure of bestowing the Freedom of Entry to the County on the Irish Naval Service. An Cathaoirleach, Cllr Cormac Devlin, presented the Award on behalf of the people of Ireland and the European Union in recognition of its humanitarian service.

It acknowledged the work of the Irish Naval Service as part of Operation Pontus, the international effort to aid migrants in the Mediterranean. The LÉ Eithne played a key role in the effort, assisting in the rescue of almost 15,000 refugees and migrants.

The crew and Captain of the LÉ Eithne, Commander Brian Fitzgerald, accepted the award on behalf of the Irish Naval Service. The public were out in force to witness this very special event, with local schoolchildren waving Irish and EU flags in celebration. The ship, which received plenty of attention from onlookers, was docked at St. Michael's Pier in Dún Laoghaire Harbour to mark the occasion. Bringing a touch of military pageantry to the proceeding was the Army No. 1 Band, which led the Colour Party and the crew of the LÉ Eithne into the Harbour.

dlr staff profile



Conor **Geraghty** dlr ROADS ENGINEER

Conor has been working as an Engineer in **dlr** since January 2008. He completed his degree in Mechanical Engineering in

NUI Galway and worked for a number of years as a Mechanical Engineer before making the move to Civil Engineering following a year in Australia. Conor has worked on a huge range of schemes for dlr.

dlr times recently spoke to Conor about his work.

How long does it take and what's involved in bringing a **scheme to fruition?** It very much depends on the scale and complexity of the scheme. The Newtown Avenue Contra Flow Cycle Track took approximately 3 weeks to design but almost 18 months to install due to the extensive consultation with residents and businesses. It was the first of its kind in Ireland and a lot of time was spent in its implementation to ensure everyone was on board. In general most schemes could be broken into the following phases:

- Concept that something needs to be changed
- Preliminary design carried out
- Public Consultation
 - presentations to the Elected Members
 - designs on pubic display
 - report back to the Members
- Finalise the preliminary design and complete detailed design
- Tender for contractor (4-6 weeks)
- Construction anything from 3 months to years

What is your average work day like? At the moment all of my schemes are onsite. My day consists of reviewing the work of the contractor and ensuring compliance with the contract, record keeping, responding to queries from the Contractor, Public, Elected Members and Businesses.

What is the most difficult part of your job? The majority of schemes I work on involve retrofitting the existing environment, often trying to add new features such as cycle facilities or traffic calming. Initially it can be difficult to prepare a design that maintains as much as possible the existing uses while adding new ones, and getting people to support the scheme. Schemes that remove parking in favour of cycle tracks, or remove road space to provide safer facilities for pedestrians, can take time and effort to get people to appreciate the value of such changes. Given that everything we do involves changing public areas, we are often faced with conflicting views from users. Trying to balance the needs of all users, which still achieving the objectives of the scheme, is the most difficult part of any project.

What is the most rewarding part of your job? I get to work on schemes that change the landscape of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown for the better. For example, the recently completed Convent Road scheme in Blackrock widened a footpath near Carysfort National School. The previous path was over capacity resulting in children and parents walking on the road to pass each other. When the upgrade was completed it provided an immediate improvement for the students and parents who walked to school. There are very few jobs where you can look at a situation and realise you can make it better. It's great to stand back at the end and see that you have actively improved the quality of life of people.
