# Ready to take the plunge

at the Dún Laoghaire Baths

An exciting new project is commencing in Dún Laoghaire with the famous Baths getting a much needed makeover. This renowned landmark will be reinvented to become a destination for sea swimmers and sea sports enthusiasts from far and wide.

The existing Baths Pavilion will be retained and will see it fitted out to provide a new public café and art gallery space. The new café will be linked to an outdoor terrace providing a great location to sit, admire and enjoy the panoramic views over Scotsman's Bay. The lower levels of the Pavilion will accommodate studio workspaces for artists and new life guard facilities.

The original Baths entrance along Windsor Terrace will be restored giving access to the Café, while new public toilet facilities at street level will be fully accessible for the mobility impaired. A new jetty and changing areas will provide access to the water's edge for swimmers and landing points for kayaks, canoes, stand-up paddle boards, etc.



The construction works will be carried out by a joint venture between SIAC Construction and Mantovani Group from Italy, who are specialists in maritime infrastructure. The works will take approximately 22 months with the new Dún Laoghaire Baths opening its doors again in the spring of 2020. Some disruption can be expected for the duration of the works but all effort will be made to keep this to a minimum. The contractors will be setting up a compound in Newtownsmith for the duration of the works resulting in the reduction of a number of car parking spaces. However, the area lies halfway between two DART stations so we would encourage people wishing to avail of the amenities at Newtownsmith and the People's Park to walk or cycle where possible, or to avail of public transport. All car parking spaces at Newtownsmith will be fully reinstated after the works have been completed. A comprehensive traffic management plan will also be in operation in the area for the duration of the project, ensuring the safety of all pedestrians and road users, with special regard given to the needs of people with disabilities.

The new Dún Laoghaire Baths will be a long-term amenity for the area and the county, and will provide not only a connection between Newtownsmith and the People's Park, but will also bring together the town of Dún Laoghaire with its seafront. The project will breathe new life into the seafront and will attract more visitors to the town and we look forward to opening it to the public in the spring of 2020.



## Council provides major funding for the development of the county

The Council's Capital Programme sets out the proposed major infrastructural projects to be undertaken, subject to funding being available, over a 3 year rolling programme. At its March meeting, Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council agreed a Capital Expenditure Programme of over €742m.

The three year Capital Programme 2018-2020 will deliver a considerable number of infrastructural and housing projects of strategic importance to the county and the region, from both a social and an economic perspective. This will shape the development of the county, creating an environment for economic renewal, jobs growth and promoting a quality of life for all.

The total cost of all projects is €742m, of which an estimated €496m will be incurred during the life of the programme.

Highlights of the programme include:

- €226m for social housing
- €202m for development of infrastructure for the new town at Cherrywood
- €75m for road infrastructure for the development of lands at Kilternan/Glenamuck
- €33m for road and public realm projects that will allow for the future growth of the Sandyford Business District
- €206m for public realm/quality of life projects, including the development of Fernhill Park in Stepaside, the development of Phase 2 of the Samuel Beckett Civic Campus and the redevelopment of the Dún Laoghaire Baths.

The Programme will be reviewed on an annual basis and projects may be added if funding and other opportunities arise.



## Rebuilding Ireland Home Loan

A Rebuilding Ireland Home Loan is a new Government-backed mortgage for first time buyers. It is available nationwide from all local authorities with the aim of allowing first time buyers apply for a loan to purchase a new or second-hand property, or to build their own home.

First-time buyers can borrow up to 90% of the market value of the property, subject to maximum market values of €320k in Cork, Dublin, Galway, Kildare, Louth, Meath and Wicklow, and €250k in the rest of the country. Further information, including eligibility requirements, interest rate options, details on how to make an application and the application form itself are available on [rebuildingirelandhomeloan.ie](http://rebuildingirelandhomeloan.ie). ## Using a Disabled Parking Permit

Disabled Person's Parking Permits (DPP) or Cards, also known as European Parking Cards or Disabled Parking Badge, are available to people living in Ireland with certain disabilities and those who are registered blind.

When using your disabled parking permit, did you know:

- You should only use your DPP for parking in a Disabled Parking Bay when you are either the driver or passenger of a vehicle. It must be clearly visible from outside the vehicle.
- Your DPP is assigned only to you and it can't be transferred.
- The misuse or duplication of a DPP may constitute a criminal offence under the Road Traffic Acts.
- Failure to display your DPP when parking in a Disabled Parking Bay may also result in a fine.
- Photocopies of a DPP are not acceptable.
- You are legally obliged to present your DPP to either the Gardaí or a Traffic Warden if asked.
- Holders of a DPP are not entitled to park in bus lanes, loading bays, clearways, single or double yellow lines, or any other restricted areas.

Holders of a DPP in Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown can park in any of dlr's paid parking areas and the Harbour area free of charge once the DPP is clearly visible from outside the vehicle. The availability of accessible parking bays supports disabled people's right to inclusion, so please remember to park considerately.





## Public Information



### Samuel Beckett Civic Campus to Expand

dlr is delighted to announce that it is proceeding with Phase 2 of the Samuel Beckett Civic Campus (SBCC) in Ballyogan.

Phase 1 was completed in February 2016 and the building houses a community centre, Crèche and leisure facilities. The outdoor spaces consist of three grass sports pitches and three synthetic sports pitches, a children's playground and skate area, a pond, a landscaped civic space and a 100 space car park.

Phase 2 will commence construction in the summer of 2019 and will consist of the following:

- a new sports building with swimming pool
- an events area within the re-landscaped civic space
- a park connecting the playing pitches with viewing benches and spectator areas
- a change of use of the current sports and community building to a libraries and communities building
- a two-storey car park

It is anticipated that the completed campus will be open in the summer of 2021.

# Civic Hub **update**



If you have been to County Hall in the last few months you will have seen the building works currently under way. Behind the hoarding, a huge amount of work is ongoing to deliver a new public space dedicated to customer service, with a new state of the art, accessible Council Chamber bringing democracy closer to all.

The dlr Civic Hub – our new customer service centre, is a digitally enhanced one-stop-shop helping to manage and deliver accessible council services on living, working, visiting and doing business in the county. The space will also showcase all council activities and events, engaging citizens and businesses in public consultations on council programmes. All channels of dlr communications will be driven through the Civic Hub - telephone, email, letter, in person, web, social media, etc.

With the Civic Hub having been designed around our customers, self-service kiosks will allow everyone to access information at the click of a button. A well-staffed public counter guarantees there will always be someone to answer a question in person. There will be a 33% increase in public opening hours, with the Hub operating from 9am to 5pm Monday to Thursday and from 9am to 4.30pm on Fridays, and will be open at lunchtime. Meeting pods will allow secluded areas for Councillors and their constituents or customers and our staff to have private conversations. These are situated in and around the Civic Hub. It is expected that the dlr Civic Hub and the new Council Chamber will be open this coming June.

## **dlr staff profile**



*Bob Hannan is a Senior Architect in the Architects' Department. After graduating with Honours from University College Dublin, he completed postgraduate studies in Urban Design at the University of Rouen France. He also holds a Master's Degree in Regional and Urban Planning. Before joining dlr in 2001, Bob worked in private practice and has considerable experience in residential, retail and commercial development. dlr times spoke to Bob about his work.*

### **What do you do?**

The Architects' Department is a busy section in the Council that deals with all areas of the built environment. My work has great variety across a broad range of projects. This has included designing civic buildings such as the Dún Laoghaire Baths, the Council's Operations Centre in Ballyogan, where the fleet that dealt with Storm Emma is based, and much smaller projects such as the Bathing Shelter and Lifeguard Hut in Sandycove. These days it's all hands on deck for housing, and I have a range of housing schemes on the board such as Rosemount Court in Dundrum and George's Place in Dún Laoghaire. Planning and urban design is a significant portion of my work, along with renewal projects like the recently completed project at Monkstown Village.

### **What is your average work day like?**

It can take months, often years, to bring a project from inception to fruition. They each generate complex issues that need to be worked through and fixed. An average day can involve task planning, managing staff, undertaking public consultation, managing consultancy teams and dealing with issues that occur during the construction phase.

### **What is the most rewarding part of your job?**

Ultimately it's the opportunity to shape our environment for the benefit of people, and to improve the quality of their life. It's a great reward when you see people enjoying a building or a public space that you have designed, such as the Metals Project in Dún Laoghaire. Also when projects achieve peer recognition for quality. Most recently the second phase of Rochestown House in Sallynoggin won 'Best Sustainable Building' at the Royal Institute of Architects Architecture Awards.

### **What is the most challenging part of your job?**

Construction is an industry with many legal and statutory requirements that need to be met. Navigating these is undoubtedly the most challenging part of my work!

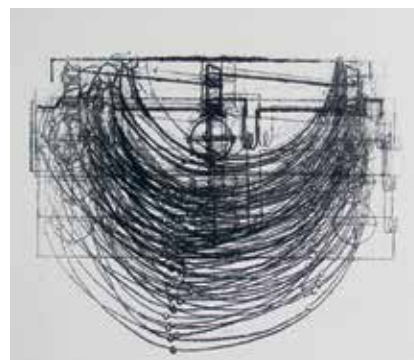
## What's on in the Gallery, dlr Lexlcon

dlr, in partnership with AIB, invited a group of women from Women4Women Network to work with artist/curator **Claire Halpin** to select an exhibition of women artists from the AIB Art Collection. Women4Women is a non-profit networking group for women with different life experiences and from different cultures living in Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County. The group met regularly to research and discuss the work and had the opportunity to visit AIB Bankcentre, Ballsbridge. AIB collected art for 30 years up to 2008 with their collection covering the period from 1880-2008. It includes more than 3000 pieces, created by many of the country's finest artists. 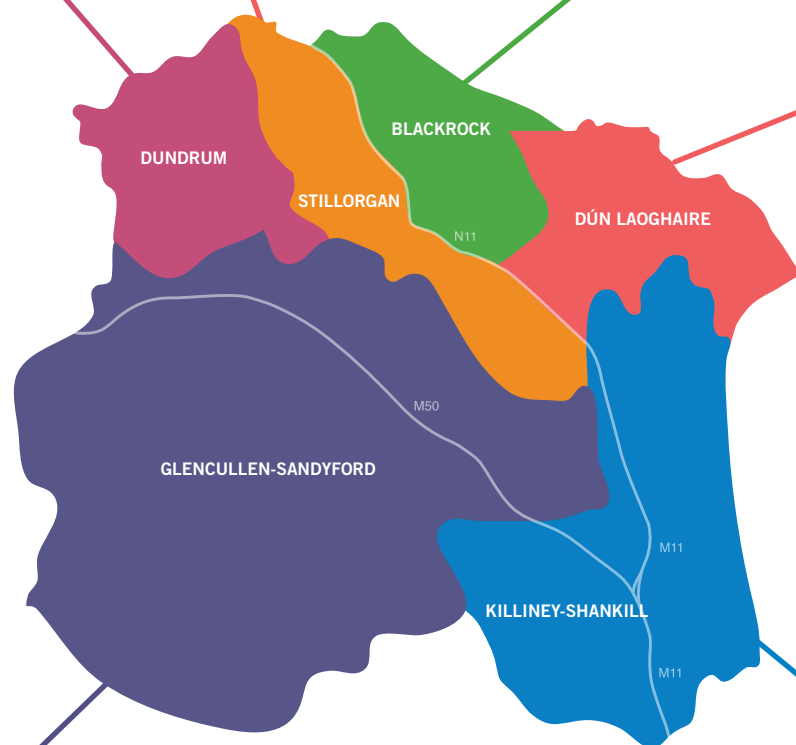
