





Municipal Services

The Ballyogan Regional Temporary Rest Centre opened its doors to Ukrainian nationals on 28 April. The Rest Centre continues to accommodate up to 300 displaced Ukrainian nationals for short periods. Over 3,000 people have stayed at the centre for short periods.

As part of a comprehensive wrap around service, accommodation services at the Centre are being supported by HSE staff including Environmental Health, Public Health and COVID-19 services. The HSE is providing onsite support to meet the healthcare needs of Ukrainian residents, and residents also have access to an offsite GP service 7 days a week.

Among the facilities available in the temporary rest centre is separate laundry and sanitary facilities, internet access, television spaces, games consoles, games room, chessboards, use of bikes and scooters, libraries of Ukrainian books for children and adults, translation services, as well as online access to Ukrainian newspapers and magazines.

Additionally, orientation and information sessions, basic English language lessons and an arts and music entertainment programme is being developed both onsite and nearby offsite.

Local coordination efforts continue to provide comprehensive support services from Southside Partnership, HSE, An Garda Siochána, Department of Social Protection, dlr Education and Training Board, TUSLA, Community and Family Resource Centres, dlr Volunteers Centre, colleagues in the East Region and a number of other community and voluntary groups.

Work is now underway to provide extra facilities, including 92 extra beds, a homework club room for children, an adult's workspace, and a new improved space for teenagers.

Deputations

Deputations with Frankfort Park Residents (Dundrum Ward) and St Patrick's Park Residents, Stepaside (Glencullen/Sandyford) both on 15th February 2023. Council staff met with Corbawn residents on 18th of February 2023.

Bus Connects

An Bord Pleanála (ABP) has advised that the decision due date for Blackrock to City Centre planning application, has been put back to before 7th April 2023. Regarding the Bray to City Centre CBC planning application, the submission of this application to ABP is now expected in Q2, 2023.

Bus Interchanges at Dundrum, Dun Laoghaire & Blackrock

Discussions are ongoing with the NTA regarding bus interchange improvements at both Dundrum and Dun Laoghaire. The improvements are needed to cater for the planned service increases under the BusConnects' programme. Meetings/workshops are ongoing to progress this work and a multi-disciplinary group from the Council is in place to assist. In addition, discussions are also ongoing with the NTA regarding potential public realm improvements in Blackrock and the impact on the existing bus interchange and bus services.

Area Based Transport Assessments (ABTAs)

Dundrum ABTA - Work on this project is progressing and the ABTAs Stages 1, 2 & 3 now completed with work on Stage 4 - Preparation of a draft Local Transport Plan/ABTA Recommendations Report, now at an advanced stage.



Racecourse South lands & Kilternan - Glenamuck– The Council, in conjunction with the NTA, is progressing Area Based Transport Assessments (ABTAs) for the Racecourse South lands at Carrickmines, in accordance with the requirements of SLO 143 in the current County Development Plan and for the Kilternan – Glenamuck area in order to support the preparation of a Local Area Plan to replace the current Kilternan – Glenamuck Local Area Plan, due to expire later this year. The Council is aiming to have a consultant appointed in Q2 to commence the studies.

3. Water & Drainage

Drainage and Flood Alleviation

Engineering and Environmental Consultants were appointed in December 2019 for Flood Risk Management works on the Deansgrange Stream. This is a 4-to-5-year project. Activities completed to date include additional survey work, CCTV surveys, a Constraints Study, Hydrological analysis, and hydraulic modelling. Optioneering, environmental surveys and engagement with key stakeholders are underway. A Ground Investigation Contract is complete, Work has begun to review sites for environmental impacts. We have received preliminary approval from Irish Rail to tunnel under the rail line. Public Consultation on the preferred option took place on the 13th December. Detailed preparation is beginning for the Part 8 submission.

Engineering and Environmental Consultants have also been appointed for Flood Risk Management Works on the Carrickmines/Shanganagh Rivers. This is a 5+ year project. Data gathering is underway. A Flow/Rainfall Survey is complete. Further topographical survey work has been done. Early damage/benefits assessments are underway to ensure a cost-beneficial scheme is achievable. An initial public engagement is complete following short briefing sessions with Area Councillors. The Hydrology/Hydraulic report is now complete and initial options are being developed. A Contractor was appointed for the Site Investigation. The on-site SI work is largely completed.

The Monkstown environs flood risk mapping project is substantially completed, and final draft mapping is awaited from the Consultants.

4. Roads Control Unit

Roads Control Unit is continuing to carry out the permanent reinstatement works throughout the administration area of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council (DLRCC) according to the current service level agreement (SLA) between Irish Water and DLRCC.

Cleansing, Beaches & Coastal Protection Updates – February 2023

- Coliemore Harbour: Project Governance Board approval was sought and granted for the construction element of the Coliemore Harbour rock anchor installation project. The constructions works are now proposed to commence in September due to further design considerations and restrictions in relation to bird nesting timelines.
- Quinns Road The beach access repair works were tendered, and a contractor has been selected. A local Councillor briefing was held to discuss the site access and contractor compound requirements. Local Resident Group communications are also



scheduled. The contractor is expected to start in March. Access onto the beach from Quinns Road will be prohibited during the 8 week construction period.

- 40 Foot Remedial Repairs One ladder has been installed thus far and the main handrail installation work is underway on site at the moment. Two replacement ladders remain to be installed and this will be completed over the next few weeks thereby completing the project.
- Public Realm cleaning is on-going presently with power washing and furniture cleaning.
- DLR Baths Maintenance crews are in place at the Baths and daily cleaning is underway to remove washed up seaweed, stones, sand etc. whilst also emptying bins.
- The Road and Cycle Lane Sweeping is on-going as per the schedules and also as per CRM requests.
- Gully Cleaning operations and early morning works are on-going.
- Beach Lifeguards applications were received and are under review by HR presently. Interviews will commence shortly.
- Bathing water sampling is ongoing at our 9 locations every fortnight as scheduled.
- The annual Bin Review is being compiled and will be finalised and ready for submission in March.

7. Dún Laoghaire Harbour

Cruise Ship Business

There are approximately 95 Cruise Ships booked in for 2023 at present with over 160,000 passengers and 68,000 crew. The first ship is due to arrive on 5th April. We are busy making preparations for the 2023 season, with a view to maximizing the guests positive experience of Dun Laoghaire when they arrive.

Grant Funding

The Brexit Adjustment Local Authority Marine Infrastructure (BALAMI) Scheme 2022 – 2023 from the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine has launched a Second Tranche call for applications. Dun Laoghaire Harbour received over \in 3 million in grant funding from the first tranche. We submitted 5 grant applications to this scheme by the deadline of 30th September 2022 and have been awarded another \in 1 million in grant funding for improvements on the Carlisle Pier.

Projects:

National Watersports Campus

DLRCC in partnership with Irish Sailing and the Irish Underwater Council have been approved in principle for Stream 1 Grant funding for the development of a National Watersports Campus. We have responded to requests for additional information and are now finalising the grant process and agreements with the project partners. An MOU has been signed with Irish Sailing and Diving Ireland in order to set out and agree the objectives of the project.

A concept brochure was presented to the Elected Members during the February council meeting and has since been published. It is hoped that this initiative will assist in building momentum and support for the project. This document will be presented to councilors in February 2023.

Berth 2 Fenders (Carlisle Pier)

A project to replace the Berth 2 fenders has been given approval to proceed to procurement stage. RPS Group have been appointed to carry out the design and procurement for this project. This project was tendered, and Sorensen Construction have been appointed to deliver the project. We are awaiting Foreshore consent to proceed to



works on site.

Grant funding has recently been secured for the installation phase of this project from the recent Brexit Local Authority Marine Infrastructure Scheme.

Berth 3 Fenders (Carlisle Pier)

Grant funding has recently been secured for a project to replace the Berth 3 fenders from the recent Brexit Local Authority Marine Infrastructure Scheme. The project has been given approval to proceed to procurement stage. RPS Group have been appointed to carry out the design and procurement for this project as it is a mirror image of the Berth 2 fender project.

Carlisle Pier Deck repairs and lighting

Grant funding has recently been secured for a project to resurface the deck of the Carlisle Pier and install lighting towers from the recent Brexit Local Authority Marine Infrastructure Scheme. The contractor has been appointed for these works which are due to commence in the coming weeks.

East Pier Revetment Repairs

Grant funding has recently been secured for a project to repair the sloping revetment at the back (east side) of the East Pier from the recent Brexit Local Authority Marine Infrastructure Scheme. This revertant provides the primary protection for the East Pier and has suffered some damage over recent years from the larger storms. Punch Consulting Engineers have been appointed to design and manage the project which is likely to be on site during the summer of 2023. Design work is complete, and this project is now out to tender.

Ferry Terminal

Retrofit works have commenced in the front office portion of the ferry terminal building. The tenant hopes to have the first sub-tenants on site in Q2 2023.

Dublin Array Windfarm

The developers of the Dublin Array Windfarm have approached the Harbour about the possibility of establishing an Operations and Maintenance Base for the windfarm. It is hoped that there might be synergies with the Ferry Terminal project. Early engagement is ongoing with the developer's team to establish the exact requirements.

Coastival Festival 2023

The Biennial Dun Laoghaire Regatta is due to take place in July 2023. We are working with several DLRCC departments to expand this into a week-long festival named "Coastival" for the Dun Laoghaire Town and Harbour areas. This is planned to run from $1^{st} - 9^{th}$ July and many DLRCC departments are involved in putting together a schedule of events.



Finance and Economic Development

Local Enterprise Office and Economic Development Unit

Energy

Andrée Dargan, dlr's County Architect and Energy Performance Officer, presented at the Sustainable Energy Authority of Ireland (SEAI) Public Sector conference held in Dublin City University (DCU). As one of the top performing local authorities in the country, Andrée spoke about dlr leadership on energy-related initiatives and emissions reductions, embedding ISO 50001 within the organisation and the challenging 2030 and 2050 targets.

The 'Reduce Your Use' campaign is continuing with a focus on the Avoid-Shift-Improve approach to reducing transport emissions and energy consumption. To date the campaign has benefitted from initiatives across multiple dlr sections including Corporate Affairs, Economic Development, Libraries, Parks and the Age-Friendly Team. Preliminary data indicates that the energy reductions across DLR buildings will surpass the 15% target set by Government. Awareness raising and social media posting is continuing, along with plans for a final staff activity, before the DLR campaign concludes at the end of March.

The dlr Energy Team successfully achieved ISO50001 re-certification, following the completion of a 3-day recertification audit last month

The Community response to the crisis in Ukraine and the influx of Ukrainian nationals into the county is being led and coordinated by Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council in collaboration with a wide range of stakeholders in the Community Response Forum, supported by a wide range of community and volunteer groups.

The Community Response Forum has been meeting since 28 March 2022 and met twice during February. Support services are being provided to those Ukrainian nationals who are being accommodated in the Ballyogan Rest Centre and Larch Hill Scout Centre as well as in hotels and in private accommodation within the County.

English classes and other activities continue to be provided in Ballyogan, Sandyford, Dundrum and Loughlinstown. English classes are also being provided in libraries. Employment support services are being organised by Southside Partnership.

Local Policing Fora (LPF)

A meeting of Dundrum Stillorgan LPF took place on 28th February 2023.

LCDC

A meeting of the LCDC took place on 22nd of February 2023. The LCDC Annual Report 2022 was approved at the LCDC meeting, and the committee have referred the Dún Laoghaire Rathdown LCDC Annual Report 2022 to the March Council meeting for noting under Section 128B of the Local Government Act 2001.

A meeting of the JPC took place Thursday the 23rd of February 2023. The JPC Annual Report 2022 was approved at the JPC meeting and in accordance with Section 36.5(a) of An Garda Síochána Act 2005 this report is submitted to the Council, the Annual Report is for noting at the March Council meeting.

GOPA are made up of older residents as well as representatives from An Garda Síochána, the Senior Alert Scheme, the dlr Older People's Council and the dlrcc Age-Friendly Programme Manager.

The **dlr Older People's Council** met again on the 17th February and will again this year be providing Transport Grants and Small Grants for events during Bealtaine & dlr Festival of Inclusion to age-friendly groups registered with the dlr Older People's Council.

The Area Community Officer and Age-Friendly Programme Manager continue to support the residents of the **Rochestown House Complex** with social activities and events.

Our popular online quiz nights continued in February. Themes alternated each week, with some quizzes geared toward families and others for adults. Over 5,000 attended the weekly Friday night quizzes throughout January and February, with an average online audience of 600 taking part in each quiz.

Events for the Neurodiverse

Continuing our programming of inclusive events for the neurodiverse, we held Fun Movement sessions with Active Academy on Saturday 11 February. We had an area with sensory toys and equipment set up for participants to use if they needed to self-regulate during the sessions. Our Magic Tables in dlr LexIcon, Deansgrange and Dalkey Libraries, continue to be booked for use by individuals and groups, and requests to borrow items from our collection of sensory toys, are ongoing.

Events for Adults

New! dlr Yarnspinners

In February, we held the first session of our Storytelling Circle for Adults. dlr Yarmspinners is aimed at gathering together people who are interested in listening to and sharing stories. We will meet on the 3rd Wednesday of each month in dlr LexIcon. For our first event, we welcomed actor, storyteller, author and broadcaster, Nuala Hayes, who opened the session by sharing some tales and will then opened to the floor and the audience of almost 50.

Get Crafty

Following on from the successful series of events in 2022, we were delighted to begin working with the craft collective The Muddle again in 2023 for online and in-person events. We held Crochet, Abstract Painting and Wire Sculpture workshops in February, with more events to be held in March.

Yoga for Adults

Sally Dunne is providing Yoga Classes in Studio Theatre, dlr LexIcon throughout January and February. Classes are for adults, with half the available spaces reserved for Ukrainian nationals living nearby.

Active Age Classes for Seniors

Active Academy were back in dlr LexIcon in February to provide active classes for Seniors. These functional fitness classes are designed to help with everyday life and are suitable for all abilities. The focus is on fitness, strength, balance, core strength and enjoyment. The aim of the classes is to get moving whilst having fun & meeting new people.

Clubs & Groups

A wide variety of clubs and groups continue to use our library spaces to meet.



These include the Language Exchanges and the Scrabble Club in Deansgrange Library, the Knitting Club in Cabinteely Library, and the Family Lego Club in Blackrock Library. The staff-led Film Club in Blackrock continues; the Ciorcal Comhrá, the informal Irish conversation group, has returned to the LexIcon Café every Tuesday morning, and a weekly Crafting Circle takes place in Shankill Library.

Each of the 8 branches have in-person book clubs, including the Audio Book Club in Dundrum Library with some also continuing with their online book clubs, due to ongoing demand. The very popular online monthly Book Club with Mary Burnham continues to meet online. The February title for discussion was *All the Broken Places* by John Boyne. As part of its centenary year celebrations, a new *Ulysses* book Club for adults is ongoing in Dundrum Library. For those who've always wanted to read this literary masterpiece, members will meet monthly to discuss two chapters at a time in order to finish the tome by Bloomsday 16 June 2023.

Exhibition Programme

Norman Ashe Aerial Photography Collection: Local views of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown in the early 1950s Level 4, dlr LexIcon

Curated by Patrick Kiersey, this wonderful exhibition consists of 30 photographs, many taken within Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown in the 1950s by Norman Ashe. They are of special interest as they depict the area when there were more fields than houses, lanes that became dual carriageways and landmarks that are no longer. Patrick Kiersey, Art/Photographer/Teacher, with a keen interest in historical photographic collections, worked in Dún Laoghaire VEC/ETB for many years. He found the collection almost by accident and is restoring the images of aerial photographs from all over Ireland taken in the early 1950s.

An Garda Síochána Centenary Exhibition Level 3, dlr LexIcon Until 31 March 2023

This exhibition gives an insight into the founding of An Garda Síochána and how An Garda Síochána developed its own style of policing in Ireland from the foundation of the state and in particular focuses on the county of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown.

The Dún Laoghaire Baths Exhibition 1843 – 2023 Level 3, dlr LexIcon Until 28 Feb 2023

Marking the reopening of the Dún Laoghaire Baths area to the public and celebrating the 180th anniversary of their original opening, this exhibition is a pictorial celebration of life, work and play in the Baths. From their origins as a private enterprise, through the Edwardian redevelopment by the Urban District Council and covering heydays and dereliction through to the present day. It charts the highs and lows of this much-loved local institution – swimming lessons, sunbathing paradise, childhood freedom, protests, ice creams and fun park. Told through the images and the voices of those who lived, worked and played in the Dún Laoghaire Baths over many years, the exhibition brings the past to life, while looking to the next chapter in the life of this iconic Dún Laoghaire attraction.

Christians in Morocco: Living Together Level, dlr LexIcon Until 28 February

This exhibition shines a spotlight on some episodes in the shared history of religious groups in Morocco, tracing the 800-year history of the Christian community there,



including the visits of Pope John Paul II in 1985 and Pope Francis in 2019. The exhibition was first presented in Christ Church Cathedral in June 2022. It was also displayed in St Mel's Cathedral in Longford, during November and December 2022.

Brigid, the Goddess, Brigid the Saint Level 5, dlr LexIcon Until 28 Feb 2023

This exhibition features a selection of books and images on St. Brigid that are part of dlr Local Studies Collection, dlr LexIcon.

NRH Photography Exhibtion Deansgrange Library Until 24 February

The artistic and varied collection of photographs in this exhibition were created by patients and staff who attended a photography course in the NRH, Dún Laoghaire.

Photography plays an important role in rehabilitation at the NRH. It can provide an excellent platform to empower patients, by developing their personal creative skills. It can help restore and rehabilitate a person's level of functioning and independence following an accident, illness or injury.
