### NOTE

*The spelling of the place name 'Kiltiernan' or 'Kilternan' has varied over the years from as early as the 17<sup>th</sup> Century, with references from various periods alternating between the spellings.*

*In the Ordnance Survey Field Name Books, a number of variations are listed. Older versions of the place name in approximate chronological order from the 17<sup>th</sup> Century include: Kiltyernan, Kiltiernan Parish, Kilturnan and Ballibetagh, Killturnan and Ballybetagh and Killternann. The researchers of the Ordnance Survey place name division recorded the following versions of the name in use in the early 19<sup>th</sup> Century: Cill Tigearnain, Kiltiernan, Kiltiernan and Kilternan.*

*In this Local Area Plan the version of 'Kiltiernan' is used based on the spelling that has been used by the Ordnance Survey since 1837.*
