World War I and Ireland's Humanitarian Effort Curated by Pádraig Allen

This exhibition, curated by St. John Ambulance Ireland. tells the stories of the noncombatants who volunteered to provide medical care and assistance for World War I casualties at home and overseas. Over 400 members of the St. John Ambulance Brigade and the British Red Cross Society turned out when the RMS Leinster was sunk, treating the injured and attending to bodies recovered from the Irish Sea. This exhibition features archives and photos. some never seen before and forms a centrepiece of the RMS Leinster commemoration events at dlr Lexicon. Also on display is a Model T Ford 1915 St John Ambulance.



Light Keepers: An exhibition by Geraldine O'Sullivan


Irish Lights 1911-1923: Safety at sea through War and upheaval A joint collaboration of the Commissioners of Irish Lights and the Royal Irish Academy

His role in bringing one of the RMS Leinster anchors to Dún Laoghaire forms part of his fascinating story. Also included is the Des Branigan maritime book collection. donated to dlr Lexicon in 2016.

The S.S. Hare and S.S. Adela: **Dublin Port in time of war** 1914-1918.

On 14 December 1917, the S.S. Hare was torpedoed as it travelled from Manchester into Dublin Port, with the loss of 12 lives. On 27 December 1917, the S.S. Adela was torpedoed as it travelled to Liverpool from Dublin Port and 24 lives were lost. This exhibition tells their story and covers the rise of the U-hoat threat 1914-18.



Charles Stanley Cuthbert: Manuscript of an Irish soldier during WWI

Thanks to the family of Charles Stanley Cuthbert who donated their grandfather's manuscript. we have an original account by a surviving Irish soldier who fought in WWI. The manuscript has been conserved and digitised and is accompanied by a number of artefacts, including shrapnel taken from a wound sustained by Charles in 1918.

He has also worked with dlr Lexicon management to develop a climate-controlled environment that will ensure the long-term preservation of the varied material held in the archive.

The Lexicon has recently accessioned a number of invaluable archival collections, including the research material of F.M. O'Flanagan; a Dalkey resident and historian, and a collection of nearly 150 glass plate photographs collected by Charles Hamilton Oswald. These important collections are currently being catalogued, and will be digitised and made available online in the near future.
