Points to remember

- Grant applications from **Sports Clubs should be submitted under Sports Development Grants**, except in the case of applications for a Community Facilities Grant
- Community Grants awarded are **based on a percentage of the cost, your** organisation will be required to fund the 20% or 30% depending on grant and/or IAD
- IAD – **Identified Area of Disadvantage** based on POBAL's HP Deprivation Index

Points to remember

- **Universal Grants 2024: Closing date: 1p.m, Wednesday 25th October 2023**
- **Groups can apply for more than one grant** provided each application relates to a different activity, event or initiative and applied for in a **separate application form**
- **Mobile Digital Devices** may be considered for funding
- **Summer Projects** must meet all Garda vetting requirements & all policies & procedures in line with Children First: National Guidelines for the Protection and Welfare of Children

Frequently Asked Questions

When will the group receive funding:

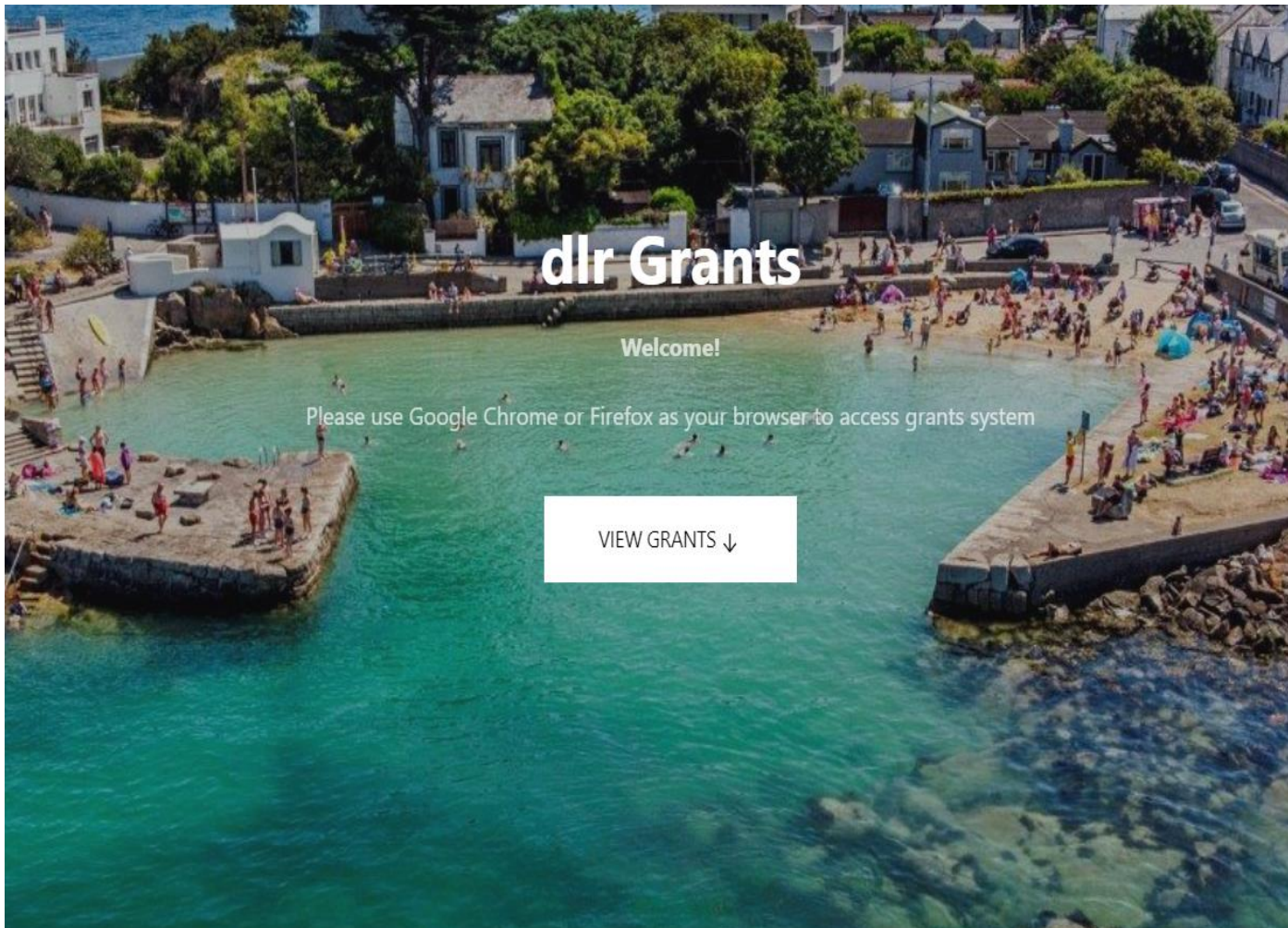
1. You will receive your letter of notification in January 2024.
2. Once notified of approval you can purchase the items awarded in the grant - **any items purchased before the approval will not qualify.**
3. Submit your receipts – you can post your receipts or scan and email to community@dlrcoco.ie
4. Funds will be electronically transferred to your account once valid receipts are received (please note this may take up to 2 weeks).

Frequently Asked Questions

What are the main reasons for refusal:

- The groups does not demonstrate the ability to **match fund** the project.
- The group is not a **constituted** community / voluntary group.
- The expenditure items **do not meet with grant criteria** ie personal items, perishable items.
- The application is **incomplete**, too vague or contains **insufficient information**
- The group **applied for the same funding/project** under another grant application with a different department within DLR.

Heritage Grants

- **What is heritage? – DLR Heritage includes**

historic buildings, places and structures; archaeology; documents and genealogy; flora and fauna; wildlife habitats; landscapes and seascapes; wrecks; geology; stories and folklore

- Who can apply? - groups and societies who have an idea for a heritage **event, publication or exhibition** (including digital)
- How much? - the maximum grant for any single project is **€5,000 (70% of project cost)**
- What is not covered - general operating expenses; advertising; hospitality; prize money; or the hire of Council premises.



Business Area Promotion Grants

- **Business Organisations and Business Representative Groups can apply for Business Area Promotion Grants**
- Up to 75% funding is available for schemes that attract customers or promote business in an area
- Type of activities that can be funded includes:
 - **Website content and update**
 - **Business Awards**
 - **Placemaking**
