TOP WALKS

EAST PIER & THE METALS 14

Rejuvenate yourself and take in breathtaking scenery with a stroll along the East Pier. Afterwards, you can amble along The Metals from Dún Laoghaire town to charming Dalkey village.

URBAN ART TRAIL

'Anseo' is the Irish language word for 'Here'. The Dún Laoghaire Anseo trail consists of over 25 pieces of unique urban street art dotted around the town of Dún Laoghaire and its harbour. The Anseo app guides you along the trail and gives you key information about the places, events and people behind the artworks: dublindiscoverytrails.ie/#dlr-anseo

HARBOUR TRAIL WALK

The ten-stop Harbour Trail app will guide you as you explore the rich history of Dún Laoghaire Harbour. The trail begins at the Tourist Information Kiosk (adjacent to Dún Laoghaire DART (train) Station) and brings you all the way down the famous East Pier. dublindiscoverytrails.ie/#dlr-harbour

KILLINEY HILL 15

DIVE IN! **BEACHES & SWIMMING SPOTS**

Fancy a dip? The Urban Splash route has 17km of coastline, with beautiful beaches and swimming spots nestled among picturesque villages and harbours. Go on, get your toes wet!

SEAPOINT 5

A popular spot for beachgoers, swimmers and other water sports enthusiasts. The Martello Tower along from **Seapoint Dart Station marks** the best point of access.

SANDYCOVE BEACH 6

This small yet perfectly formed sandy inlet is an ideal spot for families with children of all ages and has terrific views to Dún Laoghaire.



This iconic bathing pool – named by *The New York* Times as one of the 10 best places in the world to swim – is nestled within a rocky outcrop close to Sandycove Beach. Although it was originally a men-only, nude bathing spot, the Forty Foot is now open to everyone.

KILLINEY BEACH (3)

This 800m sheltered, stony beach has spectacular views to Sorrento Terrace and Bray Head. Popular with bathers, swimmers and fishermen, the beach is easily accessed by train to Killiney Dart Station.

GETTING HERE

The Urban Splash experience starts on Dublin Bay's south coast, just 7km from the city centre. Our beautiful towns and villages are perfectly placed for an activity-packed day away from the hustle and bustle of central Dublin. There are 10 **Dart train stations** along the Urban Splash trail, with many boasting great views of Dublin Bay.

DUBLIN BAY BIOSPHERE

Dublin Bay is a designated UNESCO Biosphere for nature conservation because of the diversity of mammals, birds, fish, insects and plants that live and breed in its coastal habitats. More at www.dublinbaybiosphere.ie

BOOTERSTOWN MARSH (D)

This saltmarsh bird sanctuary provides habitats for birds such as Moorhen, Reed Bunting, Sedge Warbler, Teal, Snipe, Lapwing, Oystercatcher, Redshank, Dunlin, and Brent Goose.

DALKEY ISLAND (13)

Home to a colony of seals and several bird species, Dalkey Island also has archaeological remains dating to 3000 BC. Visit the 10th-century church and the Napoleonic Martello Tower and walk on the site where Vikings once had a slave camp.
