We want to meet the challenges of the Council's Climate Action Plan.



We want to follow the laws on Public Sector Duty.

This will make sure everyone's rights are protected.



During the consultation, people told us that we need more arts spaces and more resources for the Arts Office.



People said that we need more opportunities for artists to learn and work.



People said that we need to work together with the community.

We need to hear more from children and young people.



People said that we should make sure everyone has an equal chance to take part in the Arts.



People said that we need to spread the Arts across the County.



People said that we need to hold more outdoor arts experiences.



We used all of these ideas to think about the goals for our plan.



We talked to individuals and organisations as we put the plan together.



We used focus groups and surveys to get the views of children and young people.



We had workshops and a survey for artists and arts organisations.



We had an online survey for the public.

Focus area 1 Art on Our Doorsteps



We will make sure that communities across the County can experience arts activities.



These experiences will be accessible.

This means that everyone can take part.



We want people to feel that the Arts are only 10 minutes away.



We want arts experiences in more places so everyone in our community can take part.



 Work more closely with early education, schools, and youth groups to have more arts experiences for children and young people.



 Make sure that all parts of the County benefit from Arts Office funding.



 Find new places to show artists' work.



 Grow the County Art Collection and show it in more spaces across the County.



 Tell people about local arts so they know about the experiences available to them.

Focus area 2 Connecting Communities



We will support arts programmes that connect local communities.



The Arts can help people in communities to feel that they belong.



Taking part in the Arts can help us to make friends for life.

It can be good for our mental and physical health.



Children and young people have a right to good experiences in the arts.



 Make sure children and young people see their needs and views are part of the programme of arts activities.



 Have more programmes for older people, disabled people, new people to the County and Country, and the Traveller Community.

 Work with local services and communities so everyone has equal access to the Arts.



 Have arts and cultural opportunities that help groups in society to connect and work together.

Focus area 3 Empowering Artists



We will encourage and support artists in the County to have good careers in the Arts.

 Keep funding and supporting artists. Have accessible application systems.

 Help artists build skills in community, health, education, and climate action.
 Help artists build the skills they need to support everyone to be part of the Arts.



 Support small and new arts organisations and companies to find new ways to work in the County.

Focus area 4 Making Space for Art

There is more and more demand for Arts spaces in the County.



We need new ideas for creating and developing artists' spaces.



 Look at opportunities for more space for art in the County.



 Have plans across the Council to help people use local buildings as temporary arts spaces.

Focus area 5 Building Together for the Future

The Council will spend money in the right way to grow art and culture across the County.
