Linte na Farraige

at the Martello Tower, Blackrock

Línte na Farraige (Lines of the Sea) was launched earlier this Spring at the Martello Tower, Blackrock and will run until May. The light installation is designed by Finnish artists, Pekka Niittyvirta and Timo Aho and consists of a solar powered, horizontal LED line of light, showing the future risks of rising seas and storm surges, in the year 2100 and under a high-risk scenario, where ice loss from Antarctica is greater than expected.

The installation demonstrates the need to collectively reduce our greenhouse gas emissions and adapt together to protect our coastlines and communities from the effects of climate change. The installation is based on future predictions from the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change Report AR6, and historic storm surge data in Dublin Bay.

This location has been chosen for the installation, as it speaks to a number of climate issues:

- the potential impact of climate change and sea level rise on our public amenities and public transport,
- the role that our heritage sites play in reminding us to preserve the past and protect the future, and
- the importance of our parks and green spaces, in enhancing green infrastructure and active travel.

Línte na Farraige is a recipient of the inaugural Creative Climate Action fund, an initiative from the Creative Ireland Programme, in collaboration with the Department of the Environment, Climate and Communications that supports creative, cultural and artistic projects that build awareness around climate change and empower citizens to make meaningful behavioural transformations.

Línte na Farraige is a collaborative project, with a team including Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council, scientists based at Trinity College Dublin, Maynooth University, University College Cork, the Dublin Climate Action Regional Office, Wexford County Council, Galway City Council, Fingal County Council, the Marine Institute, the National Monuments Service. A message from Chief Executive, Frank Curran

It has been a busy start to 2023 and I continue to work closely with our senior management team and local councillors on the wide range of service areas and strategic priorities.

We recently launched Línte Na Farraige at the Martello Tower in Blackrock and our aim is to highlight the future risks of rising seas and storm surges on the coastline. It demonstrates the need to collectively reduce our greenhouse gas emissions and protect our coastlines and communities from the effects of climate change. We published our progress report on our Climate Change Action Plan and in addition, we will launch the Climate Action Fund which will allow us to work with local groups to build low carbon communities, focusing on themes such as energy, travel, food & waste, recycling and local climate action.

The NTA have granted Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council €25m in funding and this will allow us to progress over 50 Active Travel projects this year which will create a better network across the county. Bike Week is back in May and we will have several events running across the county. We also adopted our Road Safety Plan for the next 8 years and our focus is to reduce the number of collisions in the County with a safe system approach to road safety management.

In Housing, construction continues at Shanganagh Castle Estate on social, cost rental and affordable homes with first units available from next year. Ballyogan Square, Moyola Court and the Coastguard Cottages are all due for completion this year. Our total social housing delivery for 2023 is projected to be 627 homes.

We are continuing to work on plans for a National Water Sports Campus in partnership with Irish Sailing & Diving Ireland and we opened new Boulles Courts in Marley and Kilbogget Park.

Myrtle Square will be completed by September and will be the new public space in the heart of Dún Laoghaire town. The space will include 66 trees which will contribute to clean air in the town and will provide a destination point and attractive space for locals and visitors to linger and relax.

As part of a community woodland project, 4,000 trees have been planted in Fernhill Park & Gardens and we completed the universal accessible entrance at Killiney Hill Park.

We are continuing to work on plans for a National Water Sports Campus in partnership with Irish Sailing & Diving Ireland and we opened new Boulles Courts in Marley and Kilbogget Park. dlr Sports Partnership and Active Cities Teams have several events planned outdoors this Summer. Look out for "Map My Park" which will offer you the opportunity to become more active in our parks.

The dlr Age Well Expo will take place in June and will showcase the many Age-Friendly activities, support services and organisations operating in the county as well as hosting well-being talks, cookery, exercise and creativity demonstrations on the day.

In Cherrywood 948 homes have been completed, 943 are currently under construction with a further 1,088 homes the subject of live planning applications. Three Parks have been fully completed and are due to open this year. There are 80 students now in the first primary school and four LUAS stops are now in place.

On the Tourism front, 90 Cruise Liners and over 150,000 guests and crews will stop off at Dún Laoghaire this year. We also have Coastival coming up in July which celebrates the maritime heritage of Dún Laoghaire and will coincide with Ireland's largest Regatta. We are also in the process of preparing our Tourism Strategy for the years ahead.


Work on the draft Dundrum Local Area Plan is progressing well and there are on-going assessments including an Area Based Transport Assessment & Environmental Assessments. Public display of the draft plan will take place later this year.

Work will start on the Glenamuck Distributor Road Scheme in June and the Blackglen Road Project will be completed in Q2.

Construction work will start at Coliemore Harbour, Dalkey in September to install rock anchors and stabilise the bedrock supporting access to the southern pier. The completion of the first phase of the Dún Laoghaire Baths project will start around the end of May with the construction of a new accessibility ramp to the lower deck of the site.

Arts & Libraries have plenty of events organised over the Spring and Summer months and I hope that you and your family will enjoy the best the county has to offer, including some sunshine!

What do you have for breakfast?

I am the new Active Cities Dublin Officer. My plan is to increase opportunities for people across the community, of all ages and abilities to become more active, with a focus on those who are least active or sedentary. My job is to work with all the other Active Cities Officers in Dublin to make it a more active city.

Dún Laoghaire

Help us shape the streets and spaces of Dún Laoghaire town. Take part in the 'Living Streets Dún Laoghaire' consultation happening this spring/summer.

Living Streets Dún Laoghaire is a new scheme involving sustainable mobility and public realm improvements. It aims to make our local streets safer and greener, our communities more connected, and to keep our economy vibrant.



Town Centre and Street Upgrades

The project proposes to add improved planting, seating and landscaping throughout the length of the main street and side streets. This will improve the look and feel of the town, and create a safe, welcoming, and vibrant environment. It includes pedestrianisation of George Street Lower (between Patrick Street and Myrtle Square) to enhance the attractiveness of this area as a destination and its economic vibrancy.



Living Streets Neighbourhood

This involves placing bollards on two to four streets within the area that is flanked by York Road, Tivoli Road, Corrig Road, Glenageary Road Lower, and George's Street. These 'modal filters' would deter rat-running (traffic cutting through the area), however, it would not prevent residents, businesses, visitors and services from accessing destination points. The resultant quieter roads, coupled with enhanced planting, will create a more inviting place to be in and to move around on foot, bike, or wheels. It will build towards the creation of a network of well-planned spaces that are safe, attractive, and accessible for all users and uses.

Sustainable Mobility Improvements

A safer walking environment will be promoted through the reduction of traffic, increased pedestrian crossings, traffic calming measures, increased footpath widths and quality and accessibility improvements. Town access will be maintained for bus and rail users through appropriate bus stop positioning, good walkways between travel options and bike parking near bus stops and train stations. Additionally, linkages between walking and cycling infrastructure such as the Coastal Mobility Route, the Metals and 'dlr Central' will be developed. Signposting, wayfinding and car parking options will be made clearer to support accessibility for those who need to drive.

Why is the project happening?

Currently, 59% of Monkstown-bound traffic in Dún Laoghaire is through-traffic and almost 50% of car trips to the town are within a 1km radius. This contributes to congestion causing emissions, noise and air pollution, as well as safety issues with an increased risk of pedestrian accidents in the area particularly among elderly and school children. Residents have been advocating for action to deter through-traffic to combat these issues and to make it safer and easier to walk, cycle and use public transport in the area.

The 'Summer Streets' pilot that was implemented from July to September 2021 has paved the way for the Living Streets proposal. This pilot was conducted after 70% of people engaged in consultation said they wanted to see pedestrianisation trialled. An evaluation post-pilot showed positive improvements across all criteria including safety, environment, accessibility, social inclusion and physical activity. During the pilot, footfall to the town increased by up to 16%, there was a 61% increase in walking reported by residents and pedestrians and in terms of changes to travel, 14% of residents reported

cycling as a result of Summer Streets. At the end of the trial, a survey with 1,210 respondents showed a majority wanted the scheme implemented permanently, with many calling for a more encompassing makeover for the town.

Living Streets will contribute to the achievement of our 'County Development Plan' (2022-2028) vision which is to "embrace inclusiveness, champion quality of life through healthy placemaking; grow and attract a diverse innovative economy; and deliver this in a manner that enhances our environment for future generations". Additionally, the project supports our national climate action efforts as one of 35 "Pathfinder" projects which are high-impact, local sustainable transport and public space initiatives supported by the government for rapid delivery nationwide by 2025. This feeds into our national climate policy goal for a 50% reduction in transport emissions by 2030 and for walking, cycling and public transport to account for 50% of all journeys.

Road Safety Plan 2022 – 2030

Reducing the number of collisions in the County

dlr has adopted its Road Safety Plan 2022 to 2030 and our focus is to reduce the high number of collisions on roads in the County. Currently about 70% of fatal and serious collisions involve pedestrians and cyclists.

Our Road Safety Plan 2022 to 2030 focuses on a holistic Safe System approach to road safety management. There are four safe systems priority intervention areas: safe roads & roadsides, safe speeds, safe road use and safe and healthy modes of travel.

Central to reducing collision numbers will be a strong focus on improved urban design for vulnerable road users and reducing traffic speeds on the road network.

The National Print Museum's exhibition travels to the Lexicon. This exhibition and book project introduces young (and not so young!) audiences to the history of book making and a story of printing in Ireland.

The affable George Thomas 'Blot' Dickson, an eighteenthcentury printer's apprentice, brings the visitor on a colourful journey, describing the evolution of bookmaking, its processes and its impacts. Dr Angela Griffith of Trinity College Dublin, an expert in history of the Irish printed image,

is the author and curator. One of the country's exciting illustrators, Jennifer Farley, has visualised George's story for the page and for the exhibition space. The creative and symbiotic partnerships between writer, illustrator and printer will be traced in a dynamic way for the reader and the visitor.

More exhibitions between April and June include Gerald Dawe, EU 50, Dublin Camera Club, PPAI and our ever-changing, in-house exhibitions on Level 5.




